It was also an occasion for pupils, parents and the neighbourhood to be in contact with local artists from various art fields and appreciate Mauritian art and culture. For this year's edition of Festival Art'la li la, we have chosen to celebrate "colours", because of their significance in the artistic world and their power to bring life, expression and emotion whenever they are used. The activities, the decoration and the art workshops followed this theme making it a very colourful Festival! TIPA team is very grateful to all the volunteers who have helped us during the Festivals and who, in doing so, supported our action. Pupil's parents, friends, family, sponsors and supporters, all gave a hand to help organise the festivals – we counted with more than 150 volunteers!

Indeed, as his plastic arts facilitator Nathalie explains, in the beginning he didn't talk much or participate in class.

Bit by bit, Parama is opening himself to others. Nathalie wishes that overtime Parama becomes aware of his true worth. In the meantime, the little man is already projecting himself into the future. When he grows up, he wants to work in construction. May he build his dreams based on respect for others, like he is doing so well already.
